Technical meeting – concern expressed by delegates that there appears to be no reports or minutes coming from the technical meetings, the system is very much reliant on what the technical director reports back to the Board meeting. Delegates also wished to see technical meetings held concurrently with the National Board meetings.

The State & Zone technical representatives would still be elected as the process now in place. For season 2007/2008 the QSCA Inc Committee of Management to seek class representation from Expressions of Interest sought from interested persons by mailout to all registered owners/drivers by 30th August 2007 (As per the registered/licenced mailing list of 30 June 2007, held by the Licencing Secretary).

Expressions of Interest to be returned to the State Secretary no later than 15th September 2007. All applications to be reviewed and the successful candidates advised by 30 September 2007.

Agenda Item 3 Sunshine Coast -

Proposal to re-vitalise Club Race Meetings and State Titles

How it Would Work > Clubs program and hold normal Club Shows > standard tow/prizemoney being paid on the night. Points allocated towards the eventual State Title winner would be 12,11,10,9,8,7,6,5,4,3,2,1 in the heats and 24,22,20,18,16,14,12,10,8,6,4,2 in the Final. 10 Attendance Points per driver per night of competition (must have been scrutineered to be qualify for Attendance Points).

The Clubs would be responsible for forwarding to the State Office of the QSCA the Official results from these race meetings where points would be allocated, stored and maintained throughout the year. A progressive points tally could be placed on the QSCA website.

The State Title would still be awarded to a Host Club in the same manner as it is now – the State Title event would be a Blue Ribbon event – only difference is that drivers would start the Title event with an accumulated Points Score from Club Shows. The Title would still be held over 2 nights and the Points scored by the drivers on this occasion would then be added to the accumulated points to find the eventual winner. The winner would be known and announced on the night. The State Title would be

worth double the normal points allocation for a State Title in both heats and final. E.g. 72,56,46,34 etc.

When It Starts > Each year it would begin at the first race meeting held immediately after the State Title and then conclude at the next years State Title.

Clubs would need to apply to the QSCA Inc for meetings to be a point scoring sanctioned meeting, to avoid the section being programmed at two or more tracks on the same night. E.g. 2 or 3 sanctioned Club Shows per track per 12 months.

Lengthy discussion on the proposal – concerns as to what it may do to state title numbers if drivers felt they couldn't travel to club race meetings, what disadvantage would it place them in etc.

Vote by secret ballot

Gladstone asked the meeting to acknowledge the work and thought process put in by the Sunshine Coast members in presenting this proposal.

South Burnett made the recommendation that the QSCA Inc look at accepting the Sunshine Coast proposal as a series.

Maryborough Item 2

Rear boot spoilers – Our drivers request to vote for the acceptance of Boot Spoilers for Street Sedans Division 1 and Street Sedans Division 2. These spoilers are to enhance the looks not the performance (example – AU Falcon must have a AU OEM spoiler fitted as per Super Street fitting specifications)

QSCA Officials – We request to vote for the acceptance that all QSCA Officials pay the entry fee at the gate for all Titles and that the QSCA Inc then reimburse each Official after the event. We are trying to make it easier for clubs to account for the cost of running a title

Executive of QSCA Inc have been working on this and from this season all appointed title officials will pay at the gate and make a claim back from the QSCA when they make a claim for travel expenses etc.

Resolved and accepted.

Item 6 – Maryborough/South Burnett

Title fees – We request that a discussion be held regarding Title fees. We feel that the "break even" point is getting harder to achieve with all the other associated costs. It only takes black clouds to turn excitement into heartbreak

State title fees – To be revised. The fees need a discount formula in the event of a shortened meeting due to rain or any other event out of control of the host club.

Lengthy and often emotional discussion on this subject. This was then left to lie on the table overnight

Meeting adjourned 4.35pm

SUNDAY 5TH

Meeting re opened 9.15am

President Paul Gannon made the recommendation that instead of continueing to go around in circles that all clubs with concerns re title costs put forward a written submission to be dealt with at the next Committee of Management which would be held within the next few weeks.

The meeting was reminded that it is the duty of the QSCA COM to ensure the organization runs at a profit and titles are part of income to the QSCA Inc which this past year has allowed the purchase of transponders/laptops/software etc. All technology comes at a cost.

Item 7 Title trophies.

Title trophies – We request to vote that the size of Trophies be dramatically increased to show the true achievement of the driver

The COM will endeavour to arrange a photo of suitable trophies and circulate for approval prior to purchase. Delegates were reminded that a small budget has been allocated for trophies and if the size of the trophies is to dramatically increase so then will the costs.

CARRIED UNAMINOUSLY

Bill Peall will liaise with Pam and between them they will do up a list of allowable changes for Modified Production so as drivers can have some idea what is permissible. These changes will be those passed and minuted since the previous specification book was printed.

Junior Sedan Specification Book – Delegates expressed great concern that the season is upon us and we still do not have a new specification book to work with – a strong recommendation to be taken to the ASCF/SSA Inc that this book be placed on hold for implementation July 2008.

All delegates felt that the ASCF/SSA Inc has lost a great deal of credibility due to the failure to deliver specification books in a timely and professional manner.

QSCA Divisions - Tony Cornelissen

Tony made the recommendation that the survey form as drawn up to be sent to all registered QSCA owners.

Following discussion a new survey form will be drawn up by the Committee of Management and forwarded to all registered owners.

A lengthy and robust discussion was then held on the direction of street and super street classes.

Promoting clubs felt that the QSCA Inc should not attempt to tell them what classes they can programme on any race night.

As this topic was becoming an emotive one President Paul Gannon assured promoting clubs that the QSCA Inc certainly had no intent of forcing clubs to programme any particular classes.

2 Promoting clubs advised that for this season they fully intended to trial running Division 1 & Division 2 Street Sedans together and sought assurance that there would be no interference from the QSCA Inc.

President Paul Gannon once again advised clubs that the QSCA Inc could not and would not be involved in telling any club what they could/should programme and that the QSCA would watch with interest to see how the trial went.

MOTION 12

Moved Tony Cornelissen QSCA Technical Rep Seconded Caboolture That the QSCA Super Street rule on fuel (page 45 #7) be amended to include the following paragraph.

'Fuel must be supplied by commercial outlet through multi volume network via bowser pump. Unleaded fuel to be supplied by Shell, Caltex, Mobil or B.P. only. EXCEPTION – AV GAS.

CARRIED.

RACING RULE BOOK – Allan Jennings

Allan advised that the QSCA Inc were fortunate to have received an advance copy of the new Racing Rules which was due to go to the printers within the week and be available close to the end of the month.

Allan gave a quick overview of the rules, stating that as he had attended a meeting of stewards in September 2006 where this book was originally presented he was pleased to see that very little had altered from the final draft at that meeting.

The new book comes with a penalty matrix which will be a very useful tool to all stewards on race night.

The rule pertaining to hitting the cone has now changed and the penalty for hitting the cone will be 'rear of the field'.

There will be no disputes committee hearing at the race track on the night, all hearings will be by tribunal set up within the state (QSCA will consider using the new stewards committee)

Allan stated that overall he felt the book would be accepted by stewards and that once the book was available in mass production he would look at holding some education training sessions.

Financial Report:

This had been held over from the previous day to allow people time to read the report. Paul congratulated Pam on once again producing a document easy to read and well laid out.

The QSCA Inc would like to formally thank the Super Sedan Association on the loan of equipment during this past season (transponders & One Way Communicator)

Pam advised that despite having purchased almost \$40,000 worth of technology and equipment the QSCA Inc was still in a sound and viable position.

Pam tabled bank statement up to the end of July inviting any delegate to inspect if they wished.

Moved Pam Franz

Seconded Rockhampton

That the financial report as presented be accepted.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

Roof Numbers: Discussion held on the need for roof numbers – decision – roof numbers will still be mandatory for Club and state title meetings as not all tracks have provision for the use of transponders.

One Way Communicators: Lengthy discussion held with a recommendation to clubs to encourage their drivers to purchase their one radio/earpiece.

Paul Broughton advised that it is their clubs intention to trial the use of one way communicators in the ASCF Junior sedan class at Archerfield this season.

As state chief steward Allan Jennings advised that he certainly recommends the use of the communicators and feels that once drivers are used to them they will also accept the benefits of better communication. The meeting adjourned at 12.45pm to hold the AGM Meeting reopened 1.25pm Division 2 Sub Committee report presented by Jim Cowley –Scanned document

Division 11 Sub Committee Report – August 2007

After much discussion and deliberation it was decided on the following:

- To encourage Clubs to offer drivers in Division 11 the opportunity to have a try in Division 1 without fear of penalty.
- To encourage Clubs to program the Feature races where possible so that the Division 11 Feature is run before the Division 1 Feature enabling the first 3 placegetters from Division 11 to start from the rear of the Division 1 Feature – as per the criteria.
- Drivers who will no longer be eligible to hold a Division 11 Licence are:
- Aaron Broadbridge (winner of the Division 11 Title 2006)
 David Kent (moved to Division 1 successfully during 2006/07)
 Bjorn Ahlstrom (competed outside the criteria)

Gary Harris, Ashley Ekins, Matt Rigby and Mick Budgen

We have acted cautiously with the above movements – over the past few seasons a number of drivers have been moved from Division 11 based on their performance in that Division and have not coped with the move and have been allowed to compete again in Division 11. Although a number of people have been moved each year the numbers in Division 1 have not changed greatly and this is a concern to us as to why these people have then dropped out of the sport.

Drivers changing to QSCA divisions from Fender Benders etc at Rockhampton. A decision was reached that:

All persons having raced in an Outlaw/Open Division will be issued with a Division 1 Licence and will be assessed when he/she is seen racing as to the need or otherwise to race in a different division. This specifically applies to competitors from the Fender Bender division at Rockhampton
